2024: Minimum: **\$439,850.25** Maximum: **\$586,467**

County Match: Average of county tax levy-related funds distributed to the LHD in the

preceding three years (2021, 2022, 2023). Will be provided in the near future.

2025: Minimum: **\$879,700.50** Maximum: **\$1,172,934**

County Match Minimum: \$197,174.25 County Match Maximum: \$262,899

Reference: Governor's Public Health Commission (GPHC)

The LaGrange County Health Department (LCHD) is recommending to the County Commissioners to opting-in to receive funding from the GPHC. Accepting the funding requires implementing additional public health core services in addition to the currently provided by the HD. For the LCHD to fulfill the GPHC funding requirements the following minimum staffing needs have been identified:

- 1. To hire a full-time **GPHC-Coordinator**
 - a. Management of the grant activities including to prepare core services plan, follow-up public health core services delivery, prepare quarterly and annual reports, support on key performance indicators (KPIs) & evaluating impact of the programs.
 - b. To work with local partners and community-based organizations to completing the County and/or community health assessments, meetings, and activities as needed, etc.
 - c. To oversee the following core services
 - i. Fatality review
 - ii. Health Equity
 - iii. Maternal and Infant Mortality
- 2. To hire a full-time **School Health Liaison**
 - a. To implementing wellness strategies to promote student's health
 - b. To supporting school in performing health screenings: vision, hearing, oral health
 - c. To provide nutritional education and breastfeeding support to WIC participants
 - d. To oversee the *Tobacco Prevention and Cessation* PH core service
- 3. To hire a full-time **Public Health Specialist/Educator/and-or Equivalent**
 - a. To oversee the following core services
 - i. Harm reduction for Trauma and injury prevention
 - ii. Lead assessment and case management
 - iii. Environmental Health Outreach & Pest/Vector Control-Mosquito surveillance
